## TE CY1Q24 Sales Down -5.0% YOY Up from the Previous Quarter

TE Connectivity disclosed a sales figure of \$3,967 million for the quarter ending March 29, 2024. This represents a decrease of -5.0% compared to the same period last year and a +3.5 increase from the previous quarter. Organically, sales were up +3% on a sequential basis.

Orders in the quarter were \$4,011 million, flat year-over-year, and up 6% sequentially with growth in all segments, resulting in a book-to-bill ratio of 1.01.

Net income for the quarter was \$541 million, up 25% YOY. TE made no acquisitions during the quarter.

## **Outlook**

TE Connectivity expects their sales in the next quarter to be approximately \$4,000 million, which is up 0.1% year-over-year, or basically flat. Growth is anticipated to be seen in the transportation and communications segments.

## **Bishop & Associates' Comments**

TE's sales increased quarter-over-quarter 3.5% in the CY first quarter 2024. TE's booking increased 6% quarter-over-quarter, led by strong (+30%) growth in the communications segment and good (+7%) growth in the industrial segment. Foreign exchange (FX) factors negatively affected the company's sales by \$50 million during the quarter.

While growth in the energy sector, which represents 6% of total sales, remained flat, TE experienced year-over-year growth in the Mil/Aero/Marine segment which accounts for 9% of sales, and the Medical segment which accounts for 5% of total sales. From an organic standpoint, growth was seen in four of the nine segments. Mil/Aero/Marine grew by 17% and Medical grew 6%. Automotive, comprising 44% of sales, saw a 3% decrease in sales YOY, and a 1% increase organically. Sensors, contributing 7% to sales, declined YOY -11% and -10% organically.
